The impressive Gutenberg Bible Facsimile, Liber Chronicarum (Nuremberg Chronicle) & Brendan Missal (approx. 60 minutes)
- The Gutenberg Bible was the earliest major book printed in Europe using mass-produced metal movable type. It marked the start of the "Gutenberg Revolution" and the age of printed books in the West. This facsimile of the Gutenberg Bible is from an edition of the Latin Vulgate printed in the 1450s by Johannes Gutenberg in Mainz. Forty-nine copies have survived. They are thought to be among the world's most valuable books.
- We will also see the Liber Chronicarum (Nuremberg Chronicle) - the most illustrated incunabula in the world with some original pages from the 1498 printing and with over 1800 engravings. Lastly, we will see the Brendan Missal – an original 15th century artifact manuscript that was used in a church dedicated to St. Brendan, in the Westphalia region.
